Introduction

Warehouse operations which are efficient and orderly tend to be safer and more successful. It is essential for the employee to transport and store the merchandise throughout the facility in an efficient and timely manner. Due to the multiple activities involved within warehouse operations, workers in warehouse settings might be at greater risk for accidents than individuals who work in areas with more limited activities. Hence, companies place a top priority on warehouse safety.

The key to avoiding accidents is understanding all of the possible warehouse dangers. Finds ways to reduce risks and always be alert for potential dangers and hazards. Do whatever is necessary to avoid accidents.

General Hazards

Common kinds of hazard in a warehouse environment are trips, falls and slips. These accidents are usually caused when staff lose their balance or stumble over an item that has not been put away correctly. Removing or placing things from storage could cause a fumble or slip, potentially causing both thing and worker to fall. The potential for falls, slips and trips is increased when workers are moving materials on various types of floor surfaces and on various levels. One more common danger is getting hit by falling objects. This is usually caused by failure to properly stack objects on shelves and other surfaces. Back injuries due to improper lifting methods are another common hazard.

There are inherent risks in using and working around workplace machinery. Accidents could often be caused from the incorrect use of conveyors, hand trucks and forklift trucks. Warehouse tools, such as pallets, skids, strapping and cutting tools, must be used cautiously in packing, unpacking and loading.

Materials which are hazardous, combustible or flammable present another kind of workplace hazard while being stored inside a warehouse. Staff have to know how to take steps to protect themselves from health dangers while working around hazardous materials.
